- Summer Reading and Math Activities were assigned





















A New Beginning at RO

- We implement Logical Consequences (examples: Loss of Privilege, You Break It/You Fix It, Detention after school for repeating challenges)










Big Ideas for Next Year at RO

- New Safety and Security Measures



Drop off and Pick up


Drop Off between 8:20am - 8:40am (bus and parent drop off)
