Dear First Grade Family,

Another school year has come to a close. Before you know it, summer will be over and it will be time for FIRST GRADE! I am excited to have your child in my class.

You may be wondering what supplies your child will need for school...the following list includes the items that your child may bring:

- 1 set of headphones (your child may already have these from kindergarten)-plain and simple so that they can be easily stored!
- 1 pair of child's scissors
- 2 **solid** glue sticks
- 2 **8-packs** of crayons -we want the eight basic colors as we learn the color words this year! Many stores promote the 24-packs—these are fine! We will put the extras aside. (Crayola preferred--tuck an extra away at home for replenishment later in the year!) -standard small size so that they fit in our containers
- 1 package of **washable** broadline colored markers(8 pack)
- 3 Expo (dry erase) markers (low odor-black, blue or purple)
 - 1 *small* refillable water bottle with straw or spout
 - 1 box of tissues (Last name A-L) -or-
 - 1 roll of paper towels (Last name M-Z)

^{*}Headphones and scissors should be labeled, but do not label anything else.

These are classroom supplies and we will organize them. It is helpful to put the small supplies into one large Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name. If purchasing these supplies is a hardship for your family, please let me know and I will supply them.

Please have your child bring a backpack to school (*without wheels*). A *small refillable* water bottle is helpful. Lunch may be purchased or brought from home. More information is available on our school website (easton.k12.ma.us).

I would also like each child to bring in a small photograph, postcard, or drawing (**no larger than 4** \times **6**) of something that he or she enjoyed this summer. I will be bringing one, too. It is a fun way to get to know each other at the beginning of the year!
